Class 1 This week has been a very exciting week for class one as we had our school trip yesterday! As our topic is all about journeys we took a long journey all the way to Falmouth. The children got on the bus from school to St Austell, then a train from St Austell to Falmouth to visit the Maritime museum. Once we were there, the children were able to make their own boats in which they raced against each other! They were so well made that none of them sank. We then explored the museum of boats before heading on the train and bus back home. The children were extremely well behaved and we are going to take what we learnt to make our own boats next week.

Class 2 have been making their boats out of all sorts of interesting materials. We concentrated on choosing materials that would float, are water-proof and not too heavy. Our previous science investigations helped us with this. In maths, the children have been ordering numbers from smallest to largest and comparing 2-digit numbers within 100. We've also begun diary writing this week which has included looking at different emotions. In story time we've been reading some Beatrix Potter books, which the children have enjoyed.

Class 3 have been exploring angles of shapes and turns in maths this week. In English they have been organising their facts about their Rainforest animal to write up a non-chronological report. Finally, we have been learning how to count to ten in Spanish!

Class 4 have had an exceptionally good week; working hard in English, writing their own adventure stories which they will share with the younger children in the school and ultimately make into a class book... and in maths interpreting and presenting data and considering properties of shape and direction. As well as this, they have been practicing for the school production. We have some great singers and budding actors who are very much looking forward to participating in the performance! Excitement is growing and preparations for the Class 4 Money Raiser are under way! The Brannel Awards Ceremony next Wednesday and the Year 5 Transition Day to Brannel next Thursday mean next week will be equally busy, but Class 4 I am sure will continue to work hard and have another enjoyable week.

Just to clarify, Friday 20th July is the last day of term. We will finish school at **1.15pm** and it will be a non-uniform day.

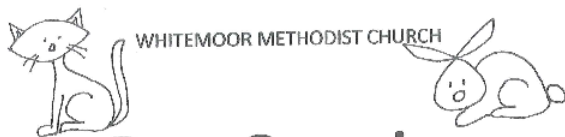
