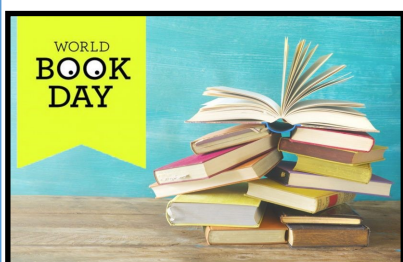


## Friday 5th March 2021

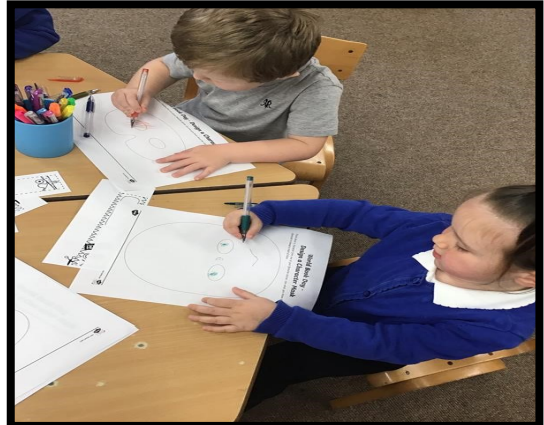

## Class 1

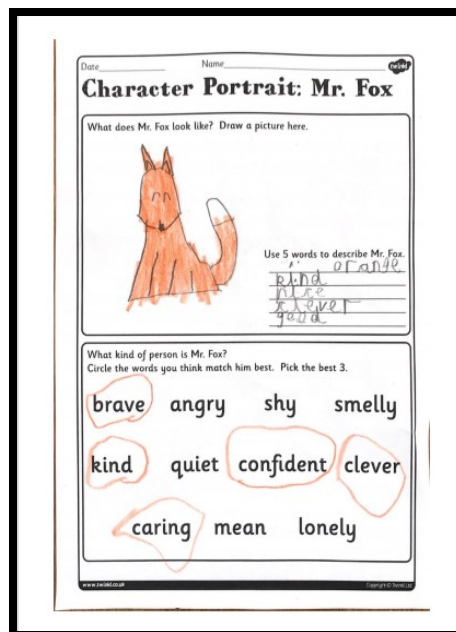
