This week in class ....

Class 1	This week in Class 1 we have worked really hard in creating their own story maps of the Billy Goats Gruff. The Reception children then thought about what the goats might do after they crossed the bridge. Great work. Nursery children have enjoyed working on their rhyming words and finding some silly rhymes. Next week we are going to be looking at Jack and the Beanstalk and see how tall some beanstalks are.
Class 2	Class 2 have focused on writing fantastic instructions for catching a star this week. In Maths, Year 1 children have worked on place value in numbers to 20, while Year 2s have continued their work with money. We have drawn characters in the style of Oliver Jeffers, looking especially at how to improve our own work, and danced imagining we were on ice - great practise for our trip next week, which we are all very excited about!
Class 3	Class 3 have been learning to use Ordinance Map symbols to locate points of interest in Geography. In computing, the children were learning to collaborate virtually by sharing a document and working on it in real-time.  In English, the children have been describing their own version of Hogwarts castle using figurative language. In our math's lessons we have been learning all about fractions and what use they are in the real-life context.
Class 4	Class 4 have had a good week and have worked very hard as always! We have started to write some great scene descriptions and have supported this with artwork in the style of Henri Rousseau. As this week has been 'Internet Safety Week' we focused our PSHE lesson on the idea of 'Think before You Click'. We used practical activities to demonstrate how fast posts can travel across the internet and how, once sent, they can seldom be erased! The children could all recognise the importance of posting responsibly and understood the need to use the internet safely. Well done Class 4!
