Attendance

If your child is going to be absent from school due to illness, then please inform the office before 9am in the morning, and let us know why your child is going to be absent, and when you expect them to return. If your child is off for more than one day, we must still be informed each day of your child's absence until they return to school.

Please note in instances of sickness and/or diarrhoea, please keep your child off school for 48 hours, timed from the last occurrence.

Flu Immunisation

You should have now received a letter regarding the Flu Immunisation which will take place in school on Friday 22nd November. Please see below all relevant information including how to give consent.

Dear Parent/Guardian,

Your child's annual nasal flu vaccination is now due Kernow Health is delivering the flu immunisation programme in Cornwall's schools on behalf of NHS England. Flu can be an unpleasant illness and sometimes causes serious complications. Vaccinating your child will also help protect more vulnerable friends and family by preventing the spread of flu. In 2019/2020 all children in Primary Schools from Reception to year 6 (inclusive) will be offered the vaccine. The vaccination is free and recommended for young children; it is administered by a quick and simple spray up the nose. If you experience any problems accessing the form please telephone 01872 221105/06 and the team will be happy to help. Please note that as in previous years you must opt in to the programme. If a consent form is not submitted your child will not be vaccinated.

School Council

The School Council will be led by Mrs Hatton and Mrs Haskayne this year and will be made up of children from Year 1 to Year 6. These children will act as a voice for their class, meeting regularly to help make decisions about our school and also supporting fund raising events. Last year, our school council successfully organised events such as Whitemoor's Got Talent and raised enough money to buy new play equipment for break and lunch times. On Monday this week, Mrs Hooper spoke to all of the children in assembly to explain what this responsibility involves and encouraged all children who are interested to sign up. Children in Class 3 and 4 have been asked to prepare a speech on why they would like to be in the School Council. This speech will be delivered to their class. Children in Class 1 and 2 have been asked to design and create a poster.

These need to be ready for Monday 16th September as the voting will take place after this date. We will announce the successful members of the School Council in next week's newsletter.

Reading

We believe that reading is one of the most important skills that a child can learn whilst they are at school. For this reason, we plan reading time every day for all children in school - this may be reading independently, reading as a group, reading one to one to an adult or even being read to.

How can you help at home?

If your child is in Year 1 - 6 then they already have a reading book and 'Reading Record' that they bring home every night. Please listen to your child read as often as possible (even if you only have time for a page or two). Whenever you do this, write something down in their Reading Record. If you are able to spend some time discussing the characters, making predictions and talking about likes and dislikes then this is even better.

We will be putting on some parent sessions to look at how you can support your child's reading at home. The first is on the 7th October for parents of children in Reception. More information will be coming out about this soon.
