

To be eligible for Pupil Premium you or your child must be receiving one of the following:

- 1. Income Support or Job Seekers Allowance
- Child Tax Credit with an annual income of less than £16,190 (provided you are not also entitled to Working Tax Credit)
- Working Tax Credit run on (paid for the 4 weeks after you stop qualify for Working Tax Credit)
- 4. Universal Credit
- 5. Pension Guarantee Credit
- 6. Income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support via Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- 8. Be a child with a parent in the armed forces

Pupil Premium



Pupil premium funding will be allocated following a needs analysis which will identify priority classes, groups or individuals.

Limited funding and resources mean that not all children receiving free school meals will be in receipt of pupil premium funding at one time.

Whitemoor Academy have the freedom to allocate pupil premium funding to any pupil or group of pupils the school has identified as being socially disadvantaged.

Pupil Premium is a government initiative that provides additional funding to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils to diminish the difference between them and their peers.
