Self-isolation rule for COVID-19 positive cases

The isolation period for people who test positive for COVID-19 is now FIVE FULL DAYS in England. This also applies to children under five, with LFD testing at parental or guardian discretion. People are able to leave isolation from the start of day 6, only after two consecutive LFD negative tests on day 5 and day 6. If either test is positive, wait 24 hours before testing again.

If the result of either of either test on day 5 and day 6 is positive, they should continue to self-isolate until they get negative results from two LFD tests on consecutive days or until they have completed 10 full days of self-isolation, whichever is earliest.

Anyone who is unable to take LFD tests, or anyone who continues to have a temperature, will need to complete the full 10 day period of self-isolation.

Please note: lingering coughs and changes to smell/taste are not a sign of ongoing infectiousness, so children can return to school if they have ended their self-isolation period.
