October is Black History Month. I feel passionately about representation, inclusivity, and diversity throughout the curriculum. I believe that it is especially important in a location such as ours where we are not fortunate enough to have a wide range of cultures around us. This Black History Month, children from across the school will be learning about a range of inspirational people. Class 1 will look at why they are all unique and how everyone is special. Class 2 will be focusing on this in music lessons, looking at the work of Bob Marley and some British Black composers. Class 3 will find out more about Mae Carol Jemison - the first black woman to travel into space and in Class 4, the children will be learning about inspirational black athletes and will link their work to PE.

We look forward to sharing some of the work with you once it has been completed.

<u>Class 1</u>

Class 1 this week have been looking at what makes them special and why they are unique. They have thought about what is special to them and how they stand out from the crowd. In phonics the Nursery children have been looking at different logos to see if they could recognise them and reception children have had their first story books. Maths there has been a lot of sorting and counting carefully.

Class 2

It's been a great week celebrating Harvest in Class 2. We learnt our Harvest Rock and Roll song complete with our own actions, and created fabulous tissue paper fruit and vegetables in Art. We've written amazing expanded noun phrases in English, sorted materials in Science and done some great work on place value in Maths. Super work everyone!

<u>Class 3</u>

Class 3 have had a great week learning about where the Anglo-Saxons settled in England and the differences between now and then. In science, we looked at vertebrates and invertebrates and designed our own animal, using our previous knowledge of how muscles work and how our skeleton add protections to our vital organs. In English, we are writing a non-chronological report on our dragon, using technical language and using our scientific knowledge of muscles and skeletons. In maths, we have been adding and subtracting using various methods and representations.

Class 4

Well done Class 4 for another great week! We have started to recap column multiplication in Maths and are continuing to research and present facts about the Vikings in English. We are really enjoying the topic books from the Schools Library Service and are learning such a lot from them! We are continuing our brass lessons in Music and making great progress. Our netball skills have also improved hugely and we clearly have same great potential for our future school team!

We are pleased to have relaunched our Accelerated Reader reading programme in school this week. Accelerated Reader (AR) is used from children in Class 2–4 to assess and encourage reading. The system allows children to complete an online quiz on their reading book once they have finished it. It then highlights how well they are understanding the books they are reading. In addition, AR produces certificates for the children which will be awarded on Friday's in our whole school celebration assembly. We can also track each classes word count. A big shout out to Charlie H in Class 3 who is currently in the lead having read a total of 129,102 words since the start of this academic year. Amazing work!

Attendance

Absence - Illness

If your child is going to be absent from school due to illness, then please inform the office before 9am in the morning, and let us know why your child is going to be absent, and when you expect them to return. If your child is off for more than one day, we must still be informed each day of your child's absence until they return to school. **Sickness / Diarrhoea - Please keep your child off school for 48 hours**

COVID-19 Absence: Self-isolating rule

From 16th August 2021 Individuals are **not** required to self-isolate if they live in the same household as someone with COVID-19, or are a close contact of someone with COVID-19, and any of the following apply:

- they are fully vaccinated
- they are below the age of 18 years and 6 months
- they have taken part in or are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial
- they are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons

Instead, they will be contacted by NHS Test and Trace, informed they have been in close contact with a positive case and advised to take a PCR test. Please take a PCR test if advised to do so and remember, **PHE do NOT recommend the use of LFD tests on children under the age of 11 years.**

Medication

The School cannot hold or administer any medication that has not been prescribed by a doctor. If your child requires prescribed medication whilst attending school, then please see the office, as you will be required to fill out an 'administration of medicine' form.

If your child requires non prescribed medication whilst at school, then you are able to come to the office at the appropriate time to administer the medicine yourself.
